#### What is ObamaCare?

- ObamaCare's goal is to give more Americans access to affordable, quality health insurance and to reduce the growth in U.S. health care spending.
- The Affordable Care Act expands the affordability, quality, and availability of private and public health insurance through <u>consumer</u> <u>protections</u>, <u>regulations</u>, <u>subsidies</u>, <u>taxes</u>, <u>insurance exchanges</u>, and other reforms.

Right now in America, there are two insurance programs that the government pays for: Medicaid and Medicare. Medicaid is insurance for people who have a low income salary and Medicare is for the old age population. Under Obama Healthcare, if you do not have health insurance and you are too young for Medicare or make too much money for Medicaid, you can buy a Health Care program that you pay an amount each month. If you do not buy one, then you will be taxed by the government.

## ObamaCare's Key Benefits, Rights, and Protections

- Letting <u>young adults</u> stay on their parents' plan until 26
- Stopping insurance companies from <u>denying</u> you coverage or charging you more based on health status
- Stopping insurance companies from <u>dropping</u> you when you are sick or if you make an honest mistake on your application
- Preventing gender discrimination

### ObamaCare's Key Benefits, Rights, and Protections

- Stopping insurance companies from imposing unjustified rate hikes
- Expanding coverage to tens of millions by <u>subsidizing health insurance costs</u> through the <u>Health Insurance</u> <u>Marketplaces</u> (<u>HealthCare.Gov</u> and the <u>state-run Marketplaces</u>)
- Expanding Medicaid to millions in states that chose to expand the program

## ObamaCare's Key Benefits, Rights, and Protections

- Providing <u>tax breaks to small businesses</u> for offering health insurance to their employees
- Requiring <u>large businesses to insure</u> <u>employees</u>
- Requiring all insurers to cover people with <u>pre-existing conditions</u>
- Making CHIP easier for kids to get
- Improving Medicare for seniors
